CELEBRATING OUR 2025 CEREMONY FOR ADIS **INTERNSHIP COHORTS**

We are proud to mark the successful completion of our 2025 Cohorts I & II internship program, welcoming students from Babcock University (6 weeks) and Bowen University (3 months). Interns gained hands-on experience applying AI in public health, advancing digital health equity, and strengthening leadership skills. They also built expertise in data analysis, visualization, and advocacy, presenting innovative solutions to drive public health transformation.

EHAI Nigeria, with support from the Pfizer Foundation, successfully hosted the Dissemination and Closeout Ceremony for the Automated Digitalized Immunization System (ADIS) Project. The event brought together dignitaries from the Kwara State Government and partners, including WHO, to celebrate its milestones.

Through the pilot, ADIS used an Electronic Immunization Register to reach over 21,000 children in 183 communities, reducing loss-to-follow-up by 60%. It also digitized the immunization records of more than 21.000 under-five children, ensuring better tracking and access to vital health data.

This achievement highlights the power of innovation, collaboration, and community engagement, while reaffirming EHAI's commitment to strengthening healthcare delivery in Kwara State and beyond.







CELEBRATING MEN'S HEALTH WEEK 2025

As part of EHAI's commitment to advancing men's health, a webinar was hosted during Men's Health Week 2025 themed "Masculinity and Health: Rethinking Men's Physical and Mental Health in the 21st Century."

The session underscored men's higher mortality rates, shorter life expectancy, and risks linked to poor health-seeking behavior, mental health challenges, violence, and injuries. Speakers emphasized breaking cultural barriers, encouraging open conversations on mental health, and promoting healthier lifestyles, while stressing the role of policy and community support.

The event concluded with a call to action for individuals, families, and institutions to work together in redefining masculinity to support longer, healthier lives for men.





EHAI AT IAS & IRCE 2025

Equitable Health Access Initiative (EHAI) proudly featured at two major international conferences in 2025. At the International AIDS Society (IAS) Conference, our staff member Faith presented her abstract on "Cervical Cancer Screening and Treatment Outcomes in Women Living with HIV (WLHIV)," a milestone achievement for both her and EHAI.

At the 3rd IRCE Scientific Symposium hosted by IHVN, Dr. Divine Akpan presented a poster on "Improving Under-Five Vaccination Coverage in Kwara: The Automated Digitalized System (ADIS)."

ADIS improves immunization by digitizing records, linking antenatal care, sending SMS reminders, and providing real-time data to health workers helping reduce zero-dose children in Nigeria.





EHAI DRIVING IMPACT IN HIV TREATMENT AND CARE

As a sub-partner to IHNV under the CDC ASPIRE grant, EHAI supports 14 healthcare facilities in Nasarawa State and FCT to deliver comprehensive HIV services, including testing, PMTCT, ART for adults and children(including pregnant women), community case management, violent prevention, ongoing monitoring and evaluation. These efforts contribute to achieving the UNAIDS 95-95-95 goals.

In FY25, EHAI has provided care and treatment to 10,690 clients in Nasarawa and 704 in FCT. Between October 2024 and September 2025, 431 clients were newly diagnosed and initiated to treatment, while 229 accessed PrER. Notably, 9,874 clients in Nasarawa and 660 in FCT achieved viral suppression, reflecting strong progress in HIV care delivery.









In May 2025, a joint supervision from the United State CDC, IHVN, and Nasarawa State Ministry of Health visited two of EHAI supported facilities- General Hospital Akwanga and General Hospital Nasarawa Eggon. The team provided recommendations to enhance service delivery and strengthen facility processes. A business system review was conducted at the EHAI Abuja office by IHVN's Grant Management Department.

To reinforce compliance with national guidelines, refresher training was organized for key focal persons and ad-hoc staff across supported facilities.

Additionally, an intern joined the Abuja office in September 2025 to undergo hands-on training.
